You can nominate any individual, group or program whom you feel has made an outstanding contribution to crime prevention and community safety.

Crime prevention leaders represent all walks of life and the ministry encourages nominations from people with diverse backgrounds. Equal opportunity will be given to all award nominations. Eligibility is based on the extent of a nominee's commitment and contribution to their own community, regardless of the community's relative size or geographic location.

The Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General recognizes that it is through the work of exemplary individuals and through strong community partnerships that we can be successful in enhancing community safety and preventing crime.

The Nomination

Selection Criteria

Nominations will be reviewed and selected based on the following:

COMMITMENT

The individual, group or program has actively participated in preventing crime and enhancing community safety.

PERSEVERANCE

The individual, group or program has helped encourage others to action or has influenced local or provincial policy and programs.

INNOVATION

The individual or group has developed an innovative crime prevention idea, project or strategy.

CONTRIBUTION

The individual, group or program has contributed towards the reduction of crime and the enhancement of community safety.

Nomination Procedure

To nominate an individual, group or program, complete a nomination form(s) and submit it to the Safe Communities Working Group Committee. The **nomination form** can be found at:

Save the form to your computer to complete if you wish to submit it by e-mail. You also have the option of printing the form to complete by hand for mailing or faxing to the committee. **Nominations can be submitted any time before the deadline of September 10, 2010.**

Please note: it is not necessary to specify which award you are nominating an individual/group/program for as the Awards Committee will select the appropriate award category. More than one recipient may be selected for each award category.

Nominations

Nominations will be reviewed on the basis of the contributions made to a specific community, no matter how large, small, urban or remote.

To nominate an individual, group or program, please complete the nomination form with a description of how this nominee's contribution to crime prevention is worthy of recognition. Nominations submitted by a police member in support of another police member must also demonstrate that they are endorsed by a member of the community.

Award Procedure

Successful candidates and nominators will be notified no later than October 15, 2010.

Awards will be presented during B.C. Crime Prevention Awareness Week – November 1 - 7, 2010.

The Awards

ANTHONY J. HULME AWARD OF DISTINCTION

The Anthony J. Hulme Award of Distinction honours the extraordinary lifetime contribution and commitment by a practitioner, volunteer or group to crime prevention and community safety.

KENNETH M. LEMCKERT COMMUNITY POLICING AWARD

The award recognizes an individual or community group that has provided exemplary leadership in the area of community policing.

WAEI T. AUDI YOUTH POLICING AWARD

This award officially recognizes police officers who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to working with youth in their communities.

CRIME PREVENTION & COMMUNITY SAFETY AWARDS

This award recognizes exemplary leadership through developing innovative projects and key activities or initiatives to promote safe communities. There are two categories:

Community Group/Organization — The nominee must be an organization, community group or individual that has provided exemplary leadership in the area of community safety and crime prevention. Contributions may include the development of innovative projects, key activities or initiatives, promotional activities, or the effective use of technology to promote safe communities.

Individual — The nominee may be in a paid or volunteer capacity working independently or on behalf of a government, police department, or community agency.

CHILDREN OR YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARD

This award honours positive role models for children or youth in their community and encourages their active participation in crime prevention and community safety projects. The nominee can be in either a paid or non-paid position. Children or youth nominated for this category should have demonstrated outstanding leadership skills and be actively involved in crime prevention and community safety projects in their communities or at school.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AWARD

This award recognizes outstanding leadership in the area of promoting and implementing crime prevention and community safety strategies in the community. The nominee should be a local government (i.e., municipality, village, regional district) that has demonstrated outstanding leadership in this area.

CORPORATE AWARD

This award recognizes a business that has made an outstanding contribution towards crime prevention and community safety strategies in British Columbia, either locally, regionally, or province-wide. The nominee should be a business or corporation (large or small) that has worked in partnership with others (e.g., local/provincial governments, community-based groups) by providing resources, assistance, financial support and program contributions towards this aim.

MEDIA AWARD

This award honours an individual in media relations or a media group that has been actively involved in promoting crime prevention and community safety programs either by audio, visual, and/or written methods (e.g., public service announcements, special programming).

SERVICE CLUB AWARD

This award recognizes outstanding contributions of a community-based service club towards crime prevention and community safety services.

VOLUNTEER AWARD

This award honours an individual's commitment, in a non-paid position as a volunteer, to their community through outstanding contribution towards crime prevention and community safety.
